Ticket entitles you to one show ticket and a seat on a deluxe coach to and from the show.



Chick Days are here!

North Wellington Co-op sources quality day old chicks, started, layer breeds , started turkeys and ready to lays from Frey's Hatchery.

Delivery Days are as follows:

March 27, April 10 and 24, May 8 and 22, June 5 and 19, July 3, August 7, September 18 and October 2.

We suggest that you order your birds at least 4 weeks in advance and that you have meat birds booked in for processing before ordering.

Credit Notes

REMINDER: Please allow *at least* 3 business days for your payment to reach us. For online, telephone and ATM bank payments, the payment credit will show on your NWC account on the day that it is credited to our bank account, not the day you initiated it. Payments mailed by cheque will be credited on the day NWC receives it in the mail, not the date on the cheque or the postage meter. Remember, our due date is the *20th* of the month following.

Voice from the Field

Winter Manure Application - Avoid it!

Once again, we are experiencing an open winter, and I know this makes it very tempting to do a winter application of manure. However, this is not a recommended practice, and should be avoided if possible. Not only do you as the farmer not get the full nutrient value from the manure, you risk having the nutrients from the manure moving into waterways (above and below ground), which can cause contamination. Farming is increasingly under pressure to minimize nutrient movement from our fields to waterways, and avoiding winter manure application is a part of the solution. If you have to move manure in the winter because you are out of manure storage space, here are some alternatives:

- Make a pile in the field you are wanting to apply the manure in the spring. Avoid placing this pile on a slope or close to a waterway
- If you have to apply to a field, please select a field that has minimal slopes. If a waterway is close to the field, please leave 100' between the manure application and the waterway.
- Avoid spreading close to drainage outlets and hickenbottoms.
- Do not apply to areas that are prone to spring flooding

If you have any other questions about manure application, please contact your NWC Crop Specialist.

If you haven't already, arrange a time to meet with your NWC Crop Specialist to develop a crop plan for your 2018 crops. This will ensure that you are putting the right crops in the right field, and that you are meeting those crops fertility requirements. Garden Corner

The weather outside is cold and snowy! Time for Canadians to take a trip down south, or at least dream of hot places! Tropicals and Houseplants are some of the best ways to explore the tropics from the comfort of your own home!

Tropicals/houseplants (Zone 6-10) are some of the most rewarding plants to have. They help filter and purify the air in your house, have aesthetic appeal, and add that bit of cheer during the long days of winter. Depending how you care for them, some houseplants live so long they become family heirlooms!

Some great starter houseplants are Spider plants, Sansevieria (Snake plant), Jade, Aloe Vera, and succulents (cactus, echieveria, Burrow's tail, etc.) These plants tolerate neglect; they do well with low-moderate light, and very little watering and fertilizing. These plants are perfect for busy households, offices, kids wanting to help garden, and rooms that do not have a lot of natural light. Other great options are Peace Lily, Philodendron, Pothos, Zeezee plant, Dieffenbachia, Dracena (corn plant), Prayer Plant, and Crotons. These plants all require low-moderate light (not direct sunlight), and do well with minimal watering (water when dry to the touch), and minimal fertilizing (about 1x/month in winter). Other more common beginner houseplants include ivy's, ferns, and palms.

If a real tropical feel is what you are after, try more unique plants like a Silver Vase Plant, Bromeliads, Monstera (Swiss Cheese Plant), Bird of Paradise, or Caladium (Elephant Ear). These plants all require moderate-bright light, warm temperatures (above 15°C), and a moderately humid environments.

If you are looking for something with bloom at this time of year, try African Violets, Cyclamen, Anthurium, Kalanchoe, Primula, or Reiger Begonia. These all require moderate light and moderate watering, and will bloom at this time of year.

By far, the most popular flowering tropical you see is Orchids. Put one in a room and it instantly feels exotic! Most people think that orchids are very tough to care for, due to their beautifully delicate flowers, but in fact, most common varieties are actually very easy to look after! They require minimal watering (about 1x/week, when bark soil is dry to the touch), low-moderate light (south or west exposure is best), prefer being potted in a clay pot, and need a moderately warm area. Many orchids hold their flowers about 3-4 months, and come in a wide variety of colours and sizes. Try one of these great houseplants today! Or pick one up for your sweetheart for Valentine's Day!
